Community Early Childhood Councils

The Kentucky Governor's Office of Early Childhood's mission is to provide leadership and direction for the Commonwealth by providing a comprehensive and sustainable prenatal to age five system that will ensure a strong foundation for all children.

Strengthening Kentucky's Community Early Childhood Councils is a critical component to accomplishing that mission. Community Early Childhood Councils were established in 2000 with a mission to mobilize local community members to build innovative, collaborative partnerships that promote school readiness. Mobilization happens by uniting crosssector partnerships to positively address policy, practice, and best address specific community needs. Local-level collaboration and coordination are vital to making the best decisions on state and local health, mental health, and wellness resources system to support children and families.

Build a Better Early Childhood System

State and local partnerships are critical to building a comprehensive early childhood system. Kentucky's Community Early Childhood Councils are the vehicle to coordinate efforts that respond to local needs. To do this, Councils should impact their community by:

- Uniting the most effective organizations in local communities around the first, critical years of a child's life
- Invest in ways to create the biggest impact, drawing on blended, braided, and leveraged resources and human capital
- Support data-driven best practices to make measurable progress toward locally defined community-wide goals
